



What is Speech Therapy?

Speech Language Pathologists, or SLPs in Early Intervention most commonly work on improving the following:

1

ARTICULATION

Articulation means the pronunciation of sounds.

2

LANGUAGE

Language includes what is understood (receptive language) and what is said (expressive language). This includes skills like following directions, grammar, and vocabulary

3

SOCIAL

Social pragmatic skills include the ability to use verbal and nonverbal social language with others. SLPs work on increasing these skills to improve communication



Barn

Great for imitating animal noises, naming animals, and prepositions



Dress-Up

Works on social language, answering questions, and labeling.



Building Blocks

Works on imaginative play and descriptive language skills

What is Early Intervention?

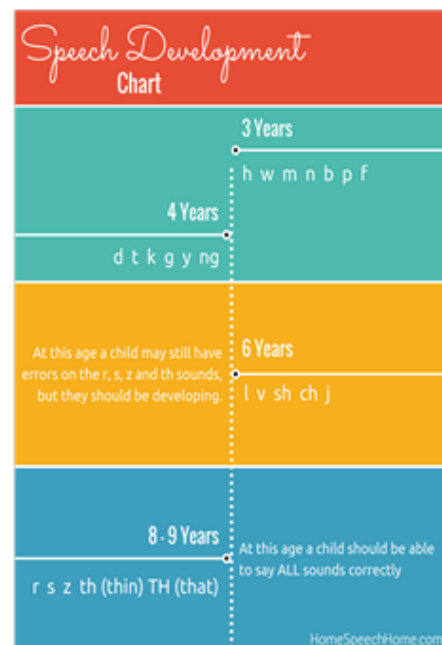

Service Delivery Models

Classroom Based: Speech Therapy is provided within the Early Childhood Special Education Classroom

Itinerant Services Outside the Home: Speech is provided in our outclient centers or in a small language based group with other students.

Early Childhood Environment: Speech Therapy is provided in the child’s preschool or daycare setting.
